Description

This tour takes you to the best birding sites of North India (such as Sultanpur Bird Sanctuary, Keoladeo National Park and National Chambal Sanctuary and Himalayan Foothills) & best Tiger Park Uttarakhand (Corbett National Park) along with the must do visit to the iconic Taj Mahal (Optional).

Sultanpur Bird Sanctuary

Situated 48 km from Delhi, Sultanpur National Park is a haven for birds, both resident and migratory. During the winter months, it attracts more than 100 varieties of migratory bird species. Although the migratory birds are the prime attraction of the park, the sight of over 150 resident bird species also promise to enthrall bird watchers. The resident population of birds includes Black-necked Stork, Egrets & Herons in large numbers, Indian Roller, Kingfishers such as White-throated, Common and Pied, Grey Hornbill, Red-collared Dove, Red & Yellow-wattled Lapwing, Rose Ringed & Alexandrine Parakeet, Thick-billed Flowerpecker, Indian Courser, Sarus Crane, Spotted Owlet, etc.

Note: The park remains closed on every Tuesday



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Keoladeo National Park

Keoladeo Ghana National Park in Rajasthan was declared a World Heritage Site in 1985. It was one of the most outstanding wetland reserves in Asia. Especially during the winters, as monsoons refill the shallow marshes, it attracts thousands of waterfowl, herons, storks, cranes, waders, owls & raptors. Spotting scores of them together dotting the marshes is also an unforgettable visual treat. The compactness of the area makes it possible to see over a hundred species in a stay of just a few days. At Bharatpur, we will arrange a private cycle rickshaw guide for you to explore the park in a unique way.



National Chambal Sanctuary

River Chambal is one of the country's most beautiful and least polluted river systems. The National Chambal Sanctuary was formed to protect this pristine river ecosystem. Over 290 species of resident and migratory bird species, including large nesting colonies of the rare Indian Skimmer, as well as Marsh Crocodiles (Muggers), Gharial (Gavials), eight species Turtles, and highly endangered Gangetic River Dolphin are found here. Best explored on boats, you will be impressed by the calm and serene beauty and the numerous sightings this river offers. The highlights usually are Indian skimmer, Black-bellied Tern, Flocks of migratory waterfowl, Cranes such as Common, Demoiselle and Sarus, etc.



Agra

A trip to India seems incomplete without a visit to the most iconic manmade structure in the world, the Taj Mahal, where we shall take you next. Built by Shah Jahan as the symbol for undying love for his wife Mumtaz Mahal, the sight of the white marble structure does take the breath away.

Note: Taj Mahal remains closed on every Friday



Corbett National Park

It was named in the honor of Jim Corbett, a legendary hunter-turned- conservationist, best known for hunting man-eating tigers and leopards in the 1920s. Corbett Park is a popular retreat for wildlife and nature enthusiasts. It provides a great opportunity for viewing wildlife, especially the tiger in its natural habitat. The mammals include the Tiger, Leopard, Elephant, 4 species of deer, Nilgai, Gharial, Wild Boar, Hedgehog, Common Musk Shrew, Flying Fox, Indian Pangolin, 3 species of Civets, Himalayan & Sloth Bear, Jackal & Red Fox, Smooth Indian Otter etc. The park is very rich in reptiles including King Cobra. Nearly 600 species of birds dwell here such Long-tailed Nightjar, Jungle owl, Spot-bellied Owl, Bristled Grassbird, Black Francolin, Purple & Crimson Sunbird, Golden-Fronted & Orange-Bellied Leafbird, Hen Harrier, Changeable & Mountain Hawk-Eagle, and many more etc.



Pangot and Sat Tal region:

Pangot is one such beautiful hamlet in the state of Uttarakhand which lies just 15 km from the city of lake, Nainital. Walking into Pangot is like stepping into a remote Himalayan village. This birdwatchers' paradise has more than 250 species of birds in and around as recorded by Jungle Lore Birding Lodge. This Lodge is India's first and foremost birding lodge and has been key to birding success in the region. The entire drive is through the forested area of Cheena Peak Range via Snow View Point and Kilbury, the main habitats for excellent birding. The forests of Pangot and surrounding areas are dominated by thick Oak, Pine and Rhododendron. The streams passing by the area makes it even more attractive place. The district of Nainital covers the tropical, sub-tropical, temperate, sub-alpine and alpine zones. The terai & bhabar belt presents the climate of the plains while the deep valleys with elevation upto 1000 Mts. play host to varied types of animal, birds, trees typical of hills as well as plains

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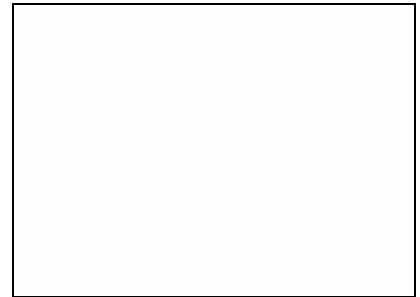

ITINERARY

Day 01: Arrive Delhi
Meals included: on own
Accommodation: Hotel Eros.

Arrive Delhi airport at noon / evening. You will be met and transferred to Hotel Eros. Our representative will brief you about your tour. Rest of the day at leisure. Overnight stay



Day 02: Delhi (Sultanpur visit)
Meals included: Breakfast
Accommodation: Hotel Eros.

Your guide and drive will meet you at 0730 hrs and will take you to Sultanpur National Park (1.5 hours' drive / subject to traffic) for half day or full day birding. Overnight stay



Day 03: Delhi to Bharatpur
Meals: Breakfast in Delhi, dinner in Bharatpur
Accommodation: Laxmi Vilas Palace.

After breakfast, check-out at 0700 hrs and drive to Bharatpur (6 hours / subject to traffic). Arrive Bharatpur in the early afternoon. Evening relax or you can go for birding in the fields outside the park. Overnight stay



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Day 04, 05 & 06: Bharatpur
Meals: Breakfast, lunch & dinner
Accommodation: Laxmi Vilas Palace.

Three full days for birding in Keoladeo National Park. Overnight stay



Day 07: Bharatpur to National Chambal Sanctuary
Meals: Breakfast and early lunch in Bharatpur, dinner in Chambal
Accommodation: Chambal Safari Lodge.

Morning at leisure. After early lunch, drive to National Chambal Sanctuary (3.5 hours drive). Arrive Chambal in the late afternoon. Evening birding in the lodge premises. Overnight stay.



Day 08: National Chambal Sanctuary
Meals: Breakfast, lunch and dinner
Accommodation: Chambal Safari Lodge.

After breakfast, Boat cruise with a guide to see Indian skimmer, black-bellied tern, flocks of migratory waterfowl, cranes such as common, demoiselle and sarus; fish-eating crocodile and marsh mugger; Gangetic dolphin; turtles etc. Return to the lodge for lunch. Evening birding around the lodge. Overnight stay



Day 09: Chambal to Noida
Meals: Breakfast and lunch in Chambal
Accommodation: Hotel Savoy Suites

Morning birding or relax. After early lunch, drive back to Noida (5-6 hours / subject to traffic). Arrive Noida in the evening. Overnight stay



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Day 10: Delhi to Nainital

Meals: Breakfast in Delhi and dinner in Nainital

Accommodation: Vikram Vintage Inn.

After breakfast, check-out and drive to Nainital (7 hours' drive / subject to traffic).

Arrive Nainital in the late afternoon. Evening relaxes. Overnight stay



Day 11 & 12: Nainital (Pangot)

Meals: Breakfast, lunch and dinner

Accommodation: Vikram Vintage Inn.

Two days of birding at Pangot village, Baggar and Gughu Khan. These walks can be very rewarding. Overnight stay at the lodge.



Day 13: Day Excursion to Sat Tal

Meals: Breakfast and dinner Nainital.

Accommodation: Vikram Vintage Inn.

Full day birding in Sat Tal. One can see a variety of Overnight stay



Day 14: Nainital to Corbett National Park

Meals: Breakfast in Nainital, Dinner in Corbett

Accommodation: Tiger Camp.

Morning drive to Corbett stopping en route at Dabka causeway to look for ashy crowned sparrow lark and for birding at Corbett Falls. Arrive Corbett in the late afternoon. Evening birding at Kosi River or Kumeria. Overnight stay at



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Day 15 & 16: Corbett National Park
Meals: Breakfast, lunch and dinner
Accommodation: Tiger Camp.

In the morning and afternoon, you will be taken for a 4WD safari to Bijrani / Jhirna / Sitabani range forest for tiger tracking and wildlife viewing. The duration of safari is about three hours and is conducted early morning and in the afternoon till sunset. Each jeep can seat upto four persons comfortably but you will have exclusive jeep for each ride. Besides the visitors, the jeep has an expert driver and a nature guide.
Overnight stay



Day 17: Corbett to Delhi
Meals: Breakfast in Corbett
Accommodation: Hotel Eros.

After breakfast, drive back to Delhi (7 hours drive / subject to traffic). Arrive Delhi in the late afternoon / evening. Overnight stay at Hotel Eros.



Day 18: Delhi to Departure
Meals: Breakfast

Morning transfer to Delhi airport to connect flight back to home. Tour ends.
